Dear parents, guardians and students,

Welcome to our second TY newsletter, highlighting the main events since returning from the mid-term break in November. In line with our HFSS TY programme, our TY students have experienced 5 academic weeks, punctuated with a variety of new learning experiences, workshops, external speakers, along with a Work Experience week, an Activity weeks and 6 academic exams. Here are some of the highlights of our busy term:

# "Intinn" Youth Film & Mental Health programme

Our TY students engaged in the "Intinn" Youth Film & Mental Health programme, presented by the Cork International Film Festival (CIFF). *Intinn* is CIFF's national film and well-being programme that offers Transition year students the opportunity to explore mental health, personal well-being and strategies of resilience, through film, questions and answers with film makers, and well-being workshops led by youth mental health specialists. This year they provided us with two new online programmes, each comprising of one short film, a recorded Q&A with the filmmaker and a well-being workshop led by Dr. John Goodwin, Lecturer in Mental Health Nursing in the School of Nursing & Midwifery, University College Cork.

## Science Week

We had a fantastic response from our TY students for entering a national TY Science Quiz, during Science Week. The virtual Science Quiz saw a plethora of HFSS TY Science groups, who led for the first part of the quiz, but did not pick up bonus points for speed in answering – our teams went for accuracy instead! Great fun was had by all, and a first for HFSS to be involved in this competition organised by the Institute of Carlow and Waterford Institute of Technology.

## World Wide Global Classroom (WWGS) initialtive

Felicia Olusanya, aka FELISPEAKS, a Nigerian Irish poet, performer & playwright from Co. Longford, based in Maynooth, currently featuring on the Leaving Certificate English curriculum with her poem "For Our Mother's", virtually visited our TY students. She performed some of her poetry, spoke of her life experiences, gave her unique perspective on the issues of racism & discrimination in Ireland, and answered questions. # Think Languages

On November 22<sup>nd</sup>, our TY students marked our national Think Languages event, which is a celebration of languages and cultures from all over the world. The day included a programme of enjoyable workshops including interpreting in EU languages, Russian & ballet, Arabic & belly dancing, Chinese Art, Danish & design, Christmas in Spain and they completed their day with a classic Italian film La vita è Bella. We value the skills involved in learning language and appreciate and encourage learning new languages in HFSS. Many thanks to all the teachers who facilitated the day and to the students for getting into the spirit of celebrating and valuing the diversity of languages and our many diverse cultures.

### **Festival of Flavours**

Our TY students were involved in Holy Family's third bite at Festival of Flavours. This splendid festival coincided with their Think Languages day. The quality and diversity of food available was exquisite, as we have 15 different first-generation countries within the school, and in total we had 18 stands on display. Traditional foods from their home countries included Jollof Rice (spicy rice from Nigeria) Pierogi (Polish dumplings), Roccos (Spanish biscuits), Ube cake (purple yam cake from the Philippines), Tiramisu (Italy), Samosas (India)and of course Irish brown bread. We deeply appreciate everyone's generosity and it was fantastic to see the bins overflowing with contributions. The Rotary club have sent the footware to the Lebanon, where they will be distributed to those in need.

### **Rainbow day**

As a school, we celebrated LGBTQI+, inclusion and awareness for a fortnight. All students participated in an LGBT+ awareness lesson and then our school community celebrated our support of inclusiveness and diversity by wearing all the different colours of the rainbow. Organised by our SRC, our TY students wore green. Many TY class tutors commented on how knowledgeable our students are on this issue. HFSS values the importance of ensuring that our school environment is a welcoming and safe place, where all our young people learn about equality, diversity and inclusion.

#### **Work Experience**

TY students were given their second opportunity to plan and organise their own work experience and write a meaningful reflection on their return to school. Many students took the opportunity to take an extra week of voluntary work experience. There was an array of careers sampled over these weeks including acting, hospitality, teaching, veterinary, equestrian work, retail, health services, pharmacy, photography, childcare, politics, work shadowing and volunteering. Students are encouraged to try a range of career types to assist them in effectively selecting their Leaving Certificate subject choices.
