## **ANTI-BULLYING STRATEGIES, POLICIES, and INTERVENTIONS**

Ms Carey is Acting Up Deputy Principal this year. She is also our Leader of Anti-Bullying Programmes. In that role, she works with all school partners (staff, students, and parents) to lead and action whole school anti-bullying awareness and intervention programmes. <u>Pupil Services Charge</u>: Voluntary secondary schools, such as HFSS, are not fully funded by the Department of Education and Skills and the pupil services charge is very necessary to make up the shortfall in funding from the government. We could not run the school without your support.

The Pupil Services Charge you contribute every year is needed to provide for important supports for your child in the school such as; personal insurance (paid by the school for each student), faith formation activities, lockers, journals, IT facilities, IT licenses (e.g. Microsoft 365/TEAMS), aptitude testing, stationery, house and mock examinations, photocopying, the school app services, subsidised uses for school events and school sporting association fees. We ask you to make this contribution to support our ongoing commitment to providing a holistic education. For further information, we refer you to the DES Circular 0065/2010 regarding 'certain charges that may be legitimately requested from pupils'.

### 'OFF & AWAY' Mobile Phone Policy

This a reminder of our Mobile phone and digital device policy. Mobiles should be 'Off and Away'; phones seen or heard will be confiscated. Phones that are confiscated will be returned to students at the end of the day in the first instance, although should there be a second occurrence, a call will be made home with the requirement for a parent/guardian to collect the phone after 5 school days.

Please do not message/call your child via mobile phone during the school day as the phone will be confiscated. Should you need to contact your child, please contact school reception.

We would ask that you discuss this at home before the school year begins and we ask for your full support as we strive together to keep the focus in our school community on effective teaching, learning, and mental wellbeing and to avoid unnecessary social media and other distractions.

Please note that it is not permissible to access social media and other apps via smart watches. Please continue to support our teaching and learning focus whilst in school.

<u>School Uniform:</u> Learning to adhere to appropriate dress codes and wear smart attire are important life skills. Our uniform policy, which is available on our school's website and in the student journal, outlines our rules. We ask you to continue supporting our uniform policy. This gives great equity to all.

<u>Lockers & Property:</u> We would like to remind you that students would need to have a very sturdy **lock for the locker.** Please keep a replica key for the locker in a safe place.
